## An affordable housing solution for all demographics

ould this be the future of housing affordability for first home buyers, investors, parents helping their kids and retirees down sizing?

Imagine having a home that generated an income stream for you while you were living there! And it doesn't involve setting up a home business. Let us introduce you to the ZONE HOME.

### What is a ZONE HOME?

- baby boomers wanting to downsize without leaving their home,
- parents wanting to give their children the chance to enter the housing market,
- older Australians wanting to fund their retirement, or
- first home buyers struggling to cover their mortgage repayments.

In all cases the ZONE HOME **provides** an opportunity to supply an income stream by renting the secondary zone while remaining in your own home and not compromising your privacy.

The advantages of a ZONE HOME extend to the community as a whole by providing:

- maximum use of resources such as land and existing infrastructure, and
- a way of increasing the density of the population without dramatically changing the visual appearance of a suburb.

### Is this the future of housing?

The last Bureau of Statistics survey revealed that **just under half the** adults aged 18 to 28 have never left home mainly because they can't afford to. This survey confirmed the depth of the housing affordability and rental crisis.

As the ZONE HOME becomes more popular, the concept could attract encouragement by government bodies. The development of special planning provisions to fast track development approvals and the establishment of contracts for home owners to set up arrangements with family and friends should enable existing housing stock to be utilised.

The key to the success of a ZONE HOME is in the initial design or renovation where the issues of compliance and practical use of the home need to be carefully considered.
